LOCAL 4-HERS HONORED AT GOLD STAR BANQUET

Twenty-five outstanding 4-H members from the Panhandle were honored at the 59th annual Gold Star Banquet which was held on the campus of WTAMU University in Canyon at the Alumni Banquet Facility on Monday, November 14. Dallam County 4-H had 2 Gold Star recipients and Hartley County 4-H had 1 recipient.

The Gold Star Award is the highest county achievement award and will be awarded only once in a member's 4-H career. The member must be at least 15, completed three years of club work, be an active member and complete a record book. "The award is intended to stimulate winners to higher achievement and to encourage other young people to participate in the county 4-H program," said Shawnte Clawson, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service 4-H specialist.

Rylee Barber is the Hartley County recipient of the Gold Star award. She is 18 years old and the daughter of Brett Barber and Nicole Barber. During her 4-H career, Rylee has participated in many projects such as Beef, Swine, Clothing & Textiles and Veterinary Science but her main project has been Beef. She has traveled all over the state and nation showing cattle and she feels that this project has had the most impact on her. Success in the show ring was definitely a highlight of her 4-H career. Rylee held various officer positions including president of her local 4-H Club as well as Hartley 4-H Council. Community Service projects she has participated in include collecting school supplies, donating baby items to the local pregnancy resource center and assisting with her school's fall carnival each year. One of her most rewarding accomplishments was advancing with her team to State 4-H Roundup two years in a row in the Food Challenge Competition. Rylee has received a Hartley County 4-H Scholarship and a Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship and she is now attending Texas A&M University in College Station.
